BOYCE HISTORICAL TIDBITS

Actions by the first Town Council

6/13/1921	An ordinance in relation to a Police Justice: In appearing to the Council of the Town of Boyce, after mature consideration, that there exists an absolute need and urgent necessity for the appointment of a Police Justice for the said Town. Be It Therefore Ordained that there shall be elected and appointed by the Council one Police Justice for said Town: with full power to enforce all ordinances and By-Laws of the Town—and to receive payment of any fines or penalties thereby provide or to direct payment to the Sergeant, Chief of Police, or Treasurer of the Town, and to enforce payment thereof. It shall be the duty of said Police Justice to keep a proper record of his proceeding and to report to the Council at it's regular monthly meeting the amounts of such fines and penalties, and whether collected by him or direct to be paid as above. And for his services hereunder shall be allowed such fees as are allowed Justices of the Peace by the State Law, to be taxed in the costs and the Sergeant or Chief of Police shall be entitled to the same fees as the Sheriff of the County is to be likewise taxed.
6/13/1921	On Motion, J F Stinson was nominated and elected Police Justice.
9/7/1921	Be it ordained by the Town Council of Boyce, VA, that all residents of Boyce shall be required to cover the deposits at all of their privies in such manner that they will be inaccessible to flies.
9/7/1921	Be it further ordained that all persons who keep hogs within the Town Limits shall keep their pens clean and in a manner that they will not be offensive. Any person violating either of the above ordinances shall pay a fine to the said Town of not less than five dollars or more than fifty dollars.
10/11/1921	Ordinance imposing Town Levy for 1921 at the same rates as last year. Seventy cents on Real and Tangible Personal Property and the legal rate on Intangible Personal Property not exceeding seventy cents. And a Poll Tax of Fifty cents per Capita.
10/11/1921	Adoption of Prohibition Act laid on the Table—Ordered.
